ACTION Notable Accomplishments

Science and Climate

The Adirondack Council worked with partners in Albany to secure \$2 million in funding for a Survey of Climate and Adirondack Lake Ecosystems (SCALE) this year. This program will sample hundreds of waterbodies across the Adirondack Park to create a long-term data set that will build our understanding of air quality, climate change, and water quality issues to help us better protect our Park. A pilot program is currently underway, where scientists and field researchers are collecting water quality data to inform the larger study when it begins.

Wilderness, Overuse and Equitable Access

The state Department of Environmental Conservation announced in March 2023 that it had selected Otak to conduct a study of visitor use management in certain areas of the High Peaks Wilderness. Otak is a national firm that has done extensive work with the National Park Service, and is a recognized expert on finding solutions to visitor use and resource management issues. Otak will work closely with the DEC over a couple of years to help determine the best ways to minimize impacts on the natural environment while still allowing for a positive visitor experience.

Timbuctoo Summer Climate and Careers Institute

The inaugural cohorts of the Timbuctoo Climate and Careers Institute came to the Adirondack Park this summer. The program brings high school students from urban communities living on the frontlines of climate change to the Adirondacks as part of a partnership between CUNY Medgar Evers and the SUNY School of Environmental Science



and Forestry. This effort provides an introduction to careers in the fields of climate change, environmental justice, and water quality. The Council pushed for this program with strong support and attendance from the Black, Puerto Rican, Hispanic, and Asian Legislative Caucus leadership. Nearly 50 teenagers signed up to participate in the various cohorts over the summer.

State Environmental Funding

In November 2022, New York voters overwhelmingly approved the \$4.2 billion Clean Water, Clean Air and Green Jobs Bond Act. The Council, along with dozens of partners state-wide, vocally supported the act, which will provide funding for critical infrastructure improvements as the Adirondacks and New York State face a changing climate. This summer/fall, State agencies held listening sessions around the state to solicit public comments, including one in Saranac Lake that had to be rescheduled due to catastrophic flooding in the central Adirondack communities of Newcomb, Long Lake, and Blue Mountain Lake. The Council will work to ensure that Bond Act funding benefits Adirondack communities in the coming years.

Protecting Clean Water and Clean Air

After suffering funding setbacks in the recent past, New York elected officials Rep. Paul Tonko and Sen. Chuck Schumer worked with a coalition of Northeast members of Congress to ensure funding for the federal CASTNET air and water quality monitoring network. CASTNET has numerous locations in and around the Adirondack Park and provides data that allow state and federal agencies to make informed decisions. The system was critical in the fight against acid rain, and continues to be a valuable tool.

Preserving Adirondack Working Lands

In honor of Earth Day, the Essex Farm Institute (EFI) - a program of the Adirondack Council - announced its latest round of farm microgrants that help Adirondack farmers and value-added producers become more resilient in the face of climate change. In 2023, EFI passed the \$200,000 mark in grants given since 2015 with a dozen grants totaling \$26,000. This year, the grants are supporting projects like installing solar panels, buying equipment for composting, replacing fossil fuel with electric implements, and much more.

Protecting Adirondack Wildlife

The Adirondack Council and its members lobbied for several bills that would benefit wildlife across New York State. Council supporters sent more than 2,000 responses to action alerts for three bills: the Birds and Bees Protection Act (BBPA), the Wildlife Crossings Act, and a ban on wildlife killing contests. The BBPA would prohibit pesticides on certain kinds of seeds to protect pollinators of all kinds; wildlife killing bans contests that promoted the killing of predators and non-game species for cash and prizes; and wildlife crossings would have had the state Department of Transportation conduct a study to determine the best places for wildlife crossings to be constructed. Birds and Bees and the wildlife killing contest ban both passed the legislature and as of printing are still waiting for Gov. Kathy Hochul's signature.




